The Farmer's Market area in front of the Parks and Recreation office is now home to a new stage, where the PRA staff is hoping to host music festivals and movie nights. It was completed just in time to host Brian Grilli, who performed for the Hoover Ridge Hops Festival in August.

The construction of the concession stand and bathroom in the baseball/ softball field area has started. Crews broke ground in early July and framing work will begin in the end of August or the beginning of September. This building will have restrooms, full service concession stand area, storage and a meeting room/storage room on the upper lev-

el.

The last proiect currently under construction is the renovation Hoover Field 5 (H5). The field will have lights and a scoreand board, immost portantly, two-story lock-



er room and press-box with restrooms. The field will be the new home for the high school softball teams instead of Waverly Yowell field.
